

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

EAST HAMPSHIRE (Land North East of Forest Lane, Lindford.)

TREE PRESERVATION ORDER (EH1219)2024

East Hampshire District Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 hereby make the following Order -

Citation

1.This Order may be cited as East Hampshire (Land North East of Forest Lane, Lindford.) Tree Preservation Order (EH1219)2024.

Interpretation

2.(1) In this Order “the authority” means East Hampshire District Council.

(2) In this Order any reference to a numbered section is a reference to the section so numbered in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and any reference to a numbered regulation is a reference to the regulation so numbered in the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation)(England) Regulations 2012.

Effect

3.(1) Subject to article 4, this Order takes effect provisionally on the date on which it is made.

(2) Without prejudice to subsection (7) of section 198 (power to make tree preservation orders) or subsection (1) of section 200 (tree preservation orders: Forestry Commissioners) and, subject to the exceptions in regulation 14, no person shall—

(a)cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or wilfully destroy; or

(b)cause or permit the cutting down, topping, lopping, wilful damage or wilful destruction of,

any tree specified in the Schedule to this Order except with the written consent of the authority in accordance with regulations 16 and 17, or of the Secretary of State in accordance with regulation 23, and, where such consent is given subject to conditions, in accordance with those conditions.

Application to trees to be planted pursuant to a condition

4. In relation to any tree identified in the first column of the Schedule by the letter “C”, being a tree to be planted pursuant to a condition imposed under paragraph (a) of section 197 (planning permission to include appropriate provision for preservation and planting of trees), this Order takes effect as from the time when the tree is planted.

SCHEDULE 1

Groups of trees
 (within a black broken line on the map)

Reference on Map	Description	Situation
G1	6x English Oak,9x Hazel,1x Holly and 1x Hawthorn	Located along the north east boundary of the meadow, nearest the highway.
G2	2x English Oak,2x Hazel	Located along the north east boundary of the meadow. G2 is adjacent to G1 where a large 'flushed' stump exists between G1 and G2.
G3	6x English Oak,9x Hazel,2x Hawthorn	Adjacent to G2 where a split Oak tree exists between G2 and G3

G4	2x English Oak, 1x Common Beech	Located remotely to the south east of the meadow.
G5	3x English Oak, 1x Common Beech	Located to the north east corner of the meadow. The trees are immediately adjacent to the highway known as of Forest Lane and Frensham Lane.

SPECIFICATION OF TREES

Trees specified individually
(encircled in green on the map)

Reference on Map	Description	Situation
T1	English Oak	Located to the north west corner of the meadow, adjacent to the highway known as Frensham Lane.
T2	English Oak	Located with the rear garden of No. 29 Grayshott Laurels. The canopy of this tree grows beyond the garden boundary into the meadow. 1m dbh
